






WHAT HAVE WE BEEN UP TO AT BCL?


The trophies for Small School's Girls, Small School's and the Overall trophy are now proudly displayed in school.

THE POWER OF ART TO INSPIRE:



Children may also earn our BcL Values badges throughout the year too for displaying our values. These will be nominated by adults and children.


PE KIT:






IMPORTANT NEWS:


MARVELLOUS MUSIC!

The music sessions delivered by the Lincolnshire Music Service have been a great success this term. The children in KS1 and in Fig class have thoroughly enjoyed the activities and we




